Road To Responsibility celebrates renovations of community-based day support program at Marshfield location

MARSHFIELD, MA, ISSUED MAY 29, 2019...Nearly 50 people turned out to celebrate with Road To Responsibility (RTR; <http://roadtoresponsibility.org>), one of the region's largest and most successful non-profit organizations, at an Open House which celebrated the renovations of the company's community-based day support program at their Marshfield location, 1831 Ocean Street.

Christopher White, CEO, and Serenity Belo, Director of Development and Communication, were greeted by well wishers, supporters and some community officials, including Marshfield School Committee/Chamber of Commerce member Lara Brait, and Katie Baxter, from the office of State Senator Patrick Kearney. The State Representative's office presented an official citation from the House of Representatives congratulating Road To Responsibility on its growth and continued success.

In addition to showing the newly renovated space and offering tours, CEO White talked about the ongoing mission of Road To Responsibility. Today, the Marshfield-based organization supports over 1,300 individuals from 110 different cities and towns in Massachusetts. With a staff of more than 700 human services professionals, RTR has built upon its success to become one of the largest developmental disabilities service providers in the state and a major regional employer.

White added, "Having just celebrated our 30th anniversary, we reflect on how far we have all come, but how much further we need to go. There are so many people and businesses we have to thank for how they have helped us – from providing employment opportunities to volunteering to help us and truly partnering with us in this mission."

Celebrating over 30 years of making lives better, Road To Responsibility, Inc. (RTR) was established in 1988 with the overarching belief that individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities deserve to have full, rich, and rewarding lives in the community, and therefore works to provide the means, the opportunity, and the support necessary to allow citizens with disabilities to take their place as productive members of the community. RTR offers residential, work/employment, day habilitation and other day supports to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. RTR supports individuals with very diverse needs, including those with significant challenges who would otherwise go unserved if not for RTR. It succeeds where other organizations often fail, through the use of an integrated clinical behavioral approach. This model has proven successful and yielded positive results for the organization and the individuals served.

Road To Responsibility offers services to almost all the towns and communities throughout the South Shore and South Coast of Massachusetts, operates 48 residences as well as co-operative and supportive living apartments, and manages nine day-service locations that focus on education, employment, and community enrichment.
